RECOMMENDATION TO THE STATE OF OHIO GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF APPALACHIA AND OHIO DEVELOPMENT SERVICES AGENCY TO SUPPORT THE PRIORITY OF PROJECTS FOR THE EASTGATE REGIONAL COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS LOCAL DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT 2018 REGIONAL JOB TRAINING (RJT) PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the Eastgate Regional Council of Governments (Eastgate) is the designated Local Development District (LDD) for Ashtabula, Mahoning and Trumbull Counties, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, in the 2018-2019 biennial budget, the Ohio General Assembly provided the Ohio Development Services Agency (ODSA) with partial program funding through the casino upfront license fees in the amount of \$4,140,018 to fund the Regional Job Training Program allocating a minimum of \$1,000,000 to each of Ohio's four Local Development Districts; and

WHEREAS, the Regional Job Training Program funds must be used to fund regional job training efforts to equip Ohio's workforce with additional skills to help grow the economy. The program is available to Ohio's 32 Appalachian counties for current and new job training efforts and to supplement the work of Ohio's workforce partners and the Appalachian Regional Commission in job training efforts; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this program is to increase the knowledge, education and skills of Ohio's Appalachian communities by supporting regional efforts to grow the economy and prepare the workforce for high paying in-demand jobs; and

WHEREAS, Eastgate has received, reviewed, evaluated and rated Regional Job Training pre-applications for the Local Development District; and

WHEREAS, the following project applications are recommended for funding based on the Eastgate Fiscal Year 2018 Regional Job Training Program Scoring Criteria; and
